On April 22, we celebrate Earth Day. That's something your co-op does every day.

In 2001, GreyStone and 15 other electric cooperatives created Green Power EMC, dedicated to bringing renewable, environmentally friendlier power to our members. Since then, 23 additional Georgia co-ops have joined.

A new alliance with Advanced Disposal and Energy Systems Group will add 4.8 megawatts (MW), raising Green Power EMC's renewable energy portfolio to 32 MW. The Valdosta plant converts landfill gas into energy, a win for the environment, energy users and the landfill.

Utility energy efficiency programs have helped members and customers save 1,171 billion kWh

of electricity nationally, enough to power 102 million U.S. homes for one year. Billions have been spent to reduce coal plant emissions, resulting in 70 percent reductions in sulfur dioxides and nitrogen oxides over the past 30 years. On April 22, let's celebrate our progress!


Now is the time to start thinking about your energy game plan. By performing your own personal energy audit and teaching your family good energy-saving tips, you

winter survey of EMCs, according to the Georgia Public Service Commission. The survey ratings are based on use of 1,000 kWh monthly and compares 42 EMCs.

GreyStone board gears up for election

Three seats on the GreyStone Board of Directors are up for election in 2013. Winners will be announced Oct. 12 at the Annual Meeting of Members.

Eligible members may become a candidate by being nominated by the Nominating Committee, or by nomination by petition of members. To be considered by the Nominating Committee, call 770-370-2066 for a nomination form, or print the online application at www.greystonepower. com. Return completed form to GreyStone by Friday, April 12. Mail completed applications to Nancy Lewis, GreyStone Power, P.O. Box 897, Douglasville, GA 30133.

A member may also be placed on the ballot by submitting a petition signed by 50 or more GreyStone members of record (the name must appear on the electric bill). Call 770-370-2066 to request a petition or print the online petition at www. greystonepower.com. The deadline to submit the completed petition to GreyStone is Thursday, July 4, by 5 p.m.

All nominees are subject to a criminal background check, must live within the geographic boundary of the district they seek and meet all other conditions of eligibility.

Candidates desiring to have their name and biographical information included in the Annual Meeting ballot edition must submit information in the format and manner required by the Credentials and Elections Committee by Friday, July 5. If you are unable to determine the district



in which you reside, or need additional information, call GreyStone's independent legal counsel, Steve Minor, at 770-214-5108.

Directors currently seeking reelection this year are Jennifer DeNyse, District 5, Carroll, Douglas; Ed Garrard, District 9, Cobb; and Charles Rutland, District 3, Douglas, Paulding counties.

Completion of work

If you are equipped, you can do the work yourself or you can hire a contractor. GreyStone will verify the completion of the improvements. You will then sign your loan documents and the check will be made payable to both you and the contractor.



DIY top three

Check your home's insula-• tion and air tightness in the attic. An insulation contractor may be required to assist. Weather stripping may need to be added or replaced to access and wall doors.

Replace old inefficient 2. windows and doors with ones that are insulated. Make sure they are properly caulked and weather stripped.

Replace dirty air filters on a regular basis. Dirty or stopped-up filters will cause the heating and cooling system to use more energy and even damage your equipment.

For Apprentice Lineman IV Shane Copeland, he remained calm as he got the call from his wife, Jennifer, at 1:30 p.m. that she was in labor and her contractions were just five minutes apart.

Shane finished his lunch and wrapped things up at work so he could head home to check on Jennifer. By the time he walked

in the door at 3:50 p.m., everything began moving at a much faster pace. With a quick call to 911, Shane went into emergency mode. By 4:10 p.m., their second daughter Palin Grace was born. Using a shoestring from a nearby sneaker, Shane was able to tie off the umbilical cord, allowing Palin to begin breathing on her own.

Shane credits the successful delivery to his safety training at GreyStone which taught him to remain cool, calm and collected during emergency situations.

STRAWBERRY CHEESECAKE PARFAIT

Ingredients:

1 pound of strawberries

2 tablespoons sugar, divided

1/2 cup graham cracker crumbs

2 tablespoons melted butter

12 ounces of cream cheese, room temperature

1/2 cup sour cream

2/3 cup confectioners' sugar, sifted

2 teaspoons Amaretto

1 cup heavy cream

Mint sprigs, for garnish

Instructions:

Slice the strawberries into a bowl and

sprinkle with one tablespoon of sugar. Toss and set aside.

Mix the graham cracker crumbs with the melted butter and one tablespoon of sugar.

Beat cream cheese with an electric mixer until smooth. Add the sour cream, confectioners' sugar and Amaretto and beat until combined.

In another bowl, whip the cream until stiff peaks form. Fold into the cream cheese mixture

Assemble Parfaits:

Place about a tablespoon of the graham cracker mixture in the bottom of your



glasses. Layer some of the cheesecake filling in the glasses, then some of the strawberry topping and sprinkle some more of the graham cracker mixture on top. (Amounts will vary according to how many you make.) Repeat layers and top with mint. Refrigerate until ready to serve.
